### **Saturday, March 23**

9:00 - Leave for Palm Springs

5:00 - Arrive at Palm Springs

6:30 - after sitting in traffic for an hour and a half, we finally arrive at the church.

9:00 - Time to go check out the strip. Each year thousands of college students come to Palm Springs for Spring Break. They have only one thing on their mind - **PARTY!!** This year is no different. Thousands of students are out cruising the boulevard; many of them are drunk and scantily dressed. All of them are lost without Jesus.

### **Sunday, March 24**

1:30 - after church and lunch, it's time to hit the streets with the gospel. Jim and I decide to try to strike up conversations with people that are hanging out on the strip.

2:30 - after sharing the gospel with a few unreceptive high schoolers, Jim and I notice a huge motor home parked across the street in a NO PARKING zone. Strangely enough, there are no tickets on the windshield and the police keep driving by not noticing it. All over the motor home are signs that say KNOW YOUR FUTURE - free inside. Jim and I decide to check it out. Inside the motor home is not a psychic, but a 63 year old evangelist who is telling people, free of charge, about the most important part of their future ~ that is where they will go when they die. Jim and I spend the rest of the afternoon talking to people stopping by the motorhome. All in all, we share the message of the gospel with at least 20 people.

7:30 - after eating dinner with the church, we learn of some of the results of our day of outreach. One girl from Fresno State had been hanging around Campus Crusade for two years but was not a Christian. Today, during our outreach, she made Jesus her Lord and Savior. One girl from San Jose State had never shared her faith before. Today, she shared her faith in Christ for the first time — in Spanish! The person she was sharing with decided to make a decision for Christ.

9:30 - while participating in a scavenger hunt, I have the opportunity to share Christ with two high school students from La Habra. Both of them are Christians but are not living their lives for Christ. Both students pray to recommit themselves to the Lord.

As you can see, many exciting things happened during our few days in Palm Springs. Not only were we able to reach out to the community but we had a great time of fellowship with each other and the local church as well. Thanks again for the impact you're making through this ministry!
